- * it is thoughtfully planned
- * it is offered on a regular basis
- * it is based on a percentage of household income
- * it is given with a sense of joy and expectation
- * we give back to God the first portion of all we have received from God
- * it is understood as an essential exercise to develop Christian character

Because you, our members, have responded to God's call:

- * Thousands worship with us via television each week and many are physically unable to attend church..

 Our service is the highest watched in its time slot.
- * We have welcomed **47 Sistema** students and their families, and over 1700 tickets were purchase for the Wynton Marsalis/Jazz at Lincoln Center Orchestra concert directly benefitting Sistema Tulsa.
- * 25 mid high youth confirmed their faith and became full, professing church members this year; 21 more are currently in Confirmation Class.
- * Over \$13,500 has been given to meet mission needs this year through United Methodist Women
- * **163 youth** in our mid high, senior high and Boy Scout Troop 20 were supported in performing over 3,842 service hours; eleven of those students earned individual honors
- * Over 2800 meals have been served to persons with mental health issues since COMPassion Meals and Worship began in April, 2014, forming a new faith community. Many have found a church home.
- *Summer camps for children and youth saw enrollments totaling over 360 participants.
- *15 college interns gained hands-on ministry leadership experience at Project Transformation. 50 at-risk children were involved at our PT site, and all maintained reading levels. Over 80% improved.
- * Mission teams served in Bolivia, at Cookson Hills Center and Spavinaw UMC, and throughout Tulsa at Restore Hope, Eastern Ok. Food Bank, Burroughs School, Nueva Esperanza UMC, etc.
- * Our church hosted over **10 community support and**arts groups, in addition to our own ministries.
- *14 choral and instrumental ensembles rehearsed, robed, and led in worship, learning 18 new choral works and 23 new instrumental works.
- * About 32,240 meals were prepared and served at the Day Center for the Homeless and at Redemption Church for those involved in prison ministries.
- * In addition to **thousands of miles logged** on our church vehicles for worship, camps and missions, 1340 charter bus miles were logged for Chapel Choir tour.
