

Come and join us for a mission at the Cookson Hills Center United Methodist Mission. The team will spend the week at the Center located in Cookson, Okla., a few miles south of Tahlequah. Sign-up begins in Bishops' Hall **Sunday, March 13.**

Work will involve maintenance, odd jobs, and repairs at Cookson facilities and nearby communities, and the team may be called on to help chauffeur kids back and forth during the Center's day-time programs.

Cookson has room for 20 people at the site. Sleeping quarters are upstairs in an air-conditioned, two-story lodge that features bunk beds. Accommodations include full dining/kitchen area, bathrooms and showers, a free laundry, and a covered back porch with tables and outdoor grills.

Missioners will furnish their own bedding, pillows, towels, personal items, closed-toe shoes or boots, work clothes, and gloves.

Wednesday is a day off work, and the team will tour the Center that morning and have the afternoon free for cultural immersion.
